Interventionism ...

... does not suffer from a lack of experts

... but from a lack of relevant knowledge

Lack of control



- Market participants
 - » Detailed decisions
 - **Competition**
- Policy makers
 - » General rules
 - **⇒** Democratic votes
- Experts in governmental bureaucracies
 - » Detailed decisions
 - ⇒ No competition, no democratic control

Science: No substitute for policy making



Science: Instruments for single goals (positive)

Policy making: Balancing multiple goals (normative)

Risk of politicized science



Outsourcing political decisions to experts ("Follow the science")




Incentives for policy-biased funding (Impact-driven vs. insight-driven research)


